I wonder would we be asking too
much. Could he tell us what he knows
and if he thinks there is still hope
we would both be very grateful
for any news he might give us.

We have waited so long now, that we would like to know, any thing it is possible to know, & would I be asking, too much, we were wondering if the two foot boys who were found dead went down with the plane.

Mrs Warren ^{had} met Clark Wilson, and said what a fine looking boy he was, & he was to have met ^{whole} crew at Easter but; unfortunately it could not be.
